From Our Pastor

My Dear Family in Christ,

December includes the four Sundays of Advent ("to come", or "appear") as we prepare for Christmas the celebration of the Incarnation or "enfleshment" (see John 1:14) of God's Son, Jesus the Christ, born of the Virginia Mary at his 1st Coming.

All of this is Gospel ("Good News"), a familiar phrase for Christians, but in the world outside the Bible, the Greek words we translate "bringing....good news" (Luke 2:10) were used to announce a new emperor over the vast Roman Empire. Emperor Augustus commands that the world be counted, with the result that those with the least are required to do the most to fulfill the requirements of those in power (has much changed?).

The scene at the manger, however, is anything but imperial. In Bethlehem, God's power is revealed in weakness and humility, and the people who count include even the migrant workers, the shepherds, keeping watch over their flocks by night.

In the infant Jesus, God declares a new way of being, a new standard for power, a word of hope "good news of great joy" (Luke 2:10) for all who are weak, all who are overlooked, all who are despised, all who are abandoned, all who are homeless, all who are hovering between life and death (of which we have witnessed so many times during the Pandemic). The Festival of the Incarnation is indeed "salvation (wholeness, completeness, peace, forgiveness, new life, restoration in God's love) to ALL."

And ALL ARE WELCOME as we celebrate this joyous festival on Christmas Eve, Friday, December 24th at 6:00 pm here at St. John. On that evening we'll gather to celebrate the Christ Mass ("Christmas") as we sing joyous carols and feast upon Jesus' Body and Blood in the Holy Communion or Lord's Supper. I hope you can be present. God's blessings to you for a Holy and Merry Christmas, and a Happy New Year of 2022.



- D. Update on Parsonage: repair of washing machine leak. A leak from the bathroom was coming thru the bathroom floor to a ceiling light downstairs. This was also fixed.
- E. Tree removal: cost was \$2250 from Great Scott. Date scheduled for removal.
- F. Nov. 1st a phone vote was taken for another leak in the roof, approved for \$3800. All voted for approval except those who were unable to be contacted (M.Hoyt and J. Byers)

- H. Web site: Council looking into updating and contacted Ken Whitaker for input his offer was \$2250. Gathering more info before starting. T. Taffee volunteered to help out with web site.

On December 1st and for the following three Wednesday nights weeks we are holding our mid-week Soup and Bread Supper followed by a Vesper Service. 
In October, Diakonia did Trick or Treat bags for the St. John School children. It made all the children very happy and was much appreciated by the school.


