August 29th Congregational Meeting

After the worship service, the meeting was called to order by President Gail Davidson.

This was an informal meeting for the congregation to voice any topics/concerns they might have.

The first topic was the **lack of volunteers**, especially, Altar Guild, Counters, Lawn Care, Coffee, etc. Karen Sutton pointed out that we have only three people signed up for Altar Guild when it takes a two-person team each month. We also only have 5 people signed up as counters, while 2 people are required each Sunday. Lawn care also needs people, as 2 people per team really can't do it all.

That brought up the subject of **hiring a lawn care service** as our volunteers are aging and the heat and humidity have been brutal this year. After much discussion, the consensus was that Council should get bids and hire a service for twice a month. This might run about \$600 per month.

The **stove** that was purchased and never used is being advertised for sale. Only one nibble so far, but that person did not call back. It was suggested that when we do sell the stove, the money might go to funding a lawn service.

Deb Midgett brought us up to date on **the state of our roof**. The leak by the library and music room has been fixed (new pipe and flange). The nursery also had a leak which soaked the carpet. The roofer looked at it and reported that walking on that roof was like "walking on a waterbed". Rain water was collecting under the rubber membrane. Again it was a blocked drain. It is now fixed, but the roof must dry before any interior repairs can be made. It was highly recommended that the drains be cleaned on a regular basis (monthly?, bi-monthly?). A suggestion was made that perhaps a Scout might take on this project.

On the subject of Home Communion, it was suggested that:

People desiring Home Communion call Pastor.

Margie Gish will coordinate calling shut-ins and volunteers.

The same communion bread and wine sets we are currently using will also be used for Home Communion.

Pastor will prepare a paper which will contain a brief service and be left with the communion set so the shut-in need not come in contact with those delivering. (Protection for both parties.)

Sheila pointed out that the CDC may soon require masks in churches, regardless of vaccination status.

Ice maker needs to be installed


A portable microphone was suggested be purchased for use during meetings.
