

The Ukraine Drive

We are concluding our four months effort to help those displaced and limited by the Russian invasion in Ukraine. We have done this in cooperation with Our Saviour Lutheran Church in Virginia Beach. They host a Ukraine school on Saturdays. The church there has been receiving and storing at their location. Persons from the school have relatives still living in that country. More than 5 cargo shipping containers have already been sent to a lawyer in one of the smaller cities. Those in the whole surrounding area come and collect items that they need.

St. John members were able to draw in a number of groups from outside of the congregation: The Talbot Assisted Living Facility, a local restaurant, Women of the ELCA, and orthodontic firm and a grant from Thrivent (formerly Thrivent Financial for Lutherans).
