Plans for a new AC system in the sanctuary were reviewed by Council, the Long Range Planning Committee and Property. Three bids will be presented to Council for a vote on the actual job to replace the system.

Pat Kindred was approved to be a contact for our investment accounts. On line access is now available. Pastor Olivier and Kathy Braswell will be removed from these accounts.

Karen Sutton and Pastor will attend the Synod assembly in early June.

The Long Range Planning Committee meets again May 3rd at the church.

WELCA is having a Spaghetti Dinner Fundraiser after Worship on May 21st. Since the food items have been donated, ticket sales will be entirely profits to the committee. WELCA plans to use the money made from the dinner at the church in some way.

The cost of flushing the blocked sewer and installing a clean out in the hallway outside St. Matthias Hall was \$3800, under the quote of \$4000.

Our next congregational meeting is July 30th.

Our organist is working on securing a storage unit for his organs currently being stored in St. Matthias.

The Geblers took our first monthly food pantry offering to Advent Episcopal. Please remember to bring canned goods, etc. and place in the basket in the Narthex.

Council agreed to invite congregational members to be a part of the Call Committee as we search for a Pastoral Candidate for when Pastor Don retires, again! (No time soon, we all hope!)


