From Our Pastor

My Dear Family in Christ,

FIRST, let me wish you a very Happy New Year, and that you will be bountifully blessed by the good Lord with the riches of His grace.

SECOND, Ash Wednesday and Easter are really early this year, the former on February 14th and the latter on March 31st. The season of Lent affords us holy time to reflect on the mighty acts of God in Jesus Christ and his atoning death on the cross.

In Medieval England, the church educated a largely illiterate population to the life, death and resurrection of Jesus through the production of "Mystery Plays"....events from Christ's life and death were portrayed on horse drawn wagons called "pageants", hence the derivation of our word "pageant". Various trade guilds competed, so to speak in dramatically presenting the events of Christ's life.

For example, the baker's guild would enact our Lord's feeding the multitude; the butcher's guild, Jesus' scourging and crucifixion; the physician's guild, our Lord's healing miracles, etc.

Two of the most famous places for these plays were Chester in the midlands and York in the North. Although we don't have these plays for the most part, we have the rich narratives of Holy Scripture and special services geared toward the deepening of our own faith for this 40 day (minus Sundays) Church Season.

THIRD, let me thank you - the congregation - for your gifts, prayers and presence. We have accomplished much that borders on the miraculous: the liquidation of around two decades of deferred maintenance on the church's physical property! This will free us up to move from a maintenance orientation to a mission orientation: evangelism, nurture and outreach to the community God created here over 70 years ago; more on this later. Once again, heartfelt thanks to all you for the cause of Christ's Church in this place.


