#### From Our Council President

For those who have not heard - our Interim Pastor Don Wilson submitted his resignation effective March 31, 2024. He has faithfully served this congregation for just shy of 6 years. Pastor Don plans to continue serving us as part of the pulpit supply as we activate the Call Committee process. We are blessed with two retired pastors attending services as well as our area Dean. Cheryl Gebler agreed to serve as Call Committee Chair. Once this committee meets with the Bishop and Synod Call Committee Rep Rebecca Walls, we will update our MSP with information from the Congregational Survey.

Ellen Wilson has been working tirelessly on the "to do' list resulting from the recent building inspection by the City's Fire Marshall. The permit for the eternal candle was issued, framed and will be hung. The fire door outside of the men's room did not pass inspection. It was bolted in an open position; work is underway to restore its functioning.

Our Scouts contributed 267 items collected this month during their food drive. Items have been delivered to Advent's Food Pantry. As of the middle of March our total collected this year is 564. We are well on the way to meeting the goal for 2024.

We accepted St. Timothy's invitation to celebrate the Seder Meal on March 30th as part of our Holy Week services. We agreed to host the event since the request was made to use our kitchen.

WELCA proposed we install a wooden railing in the middle of the steps to the altar. Adding this will assist Worship Assistants who carry the cross to and from the altar as part of the service.

Gerard Gebler confirmed our trustees should be bonded.

We are in discussion with a Norfolk based home school group who would like the use of our space 2-3 days a week beginning in September 2024. Details are being worked out. Most of the students are middle and high schoolers. A parent from each family will be on site with the youth. They are also interested in assisting with our school's plan to sell the curriculum in June. This group carries their own insurance.

Grace Lutheran has offered the assistance of their internal audit committee. At the Bishop's request, both the School and Church books will be audited. Our Financial Secretary has reports from 2021 forward; the last audit was done in 2018.

WELCA moved its monthly meeting time to follow the SENRETS on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of each month.

Our next "Invite a Friend" Sunday event is April 21st with a pancake breakfast hosted by our trustees. Our first one was attended by 5 guests. Gerard is keeping a list of those who attend. Thank You notes were sent to our guests. As Pastor Don says, we have moved from maintenance to mission-spreading the word by inviting others to join us in worship and growing the Congregation.
